SUPPLEMENT TO OFFICIAL RULE 1.0

Organization of the U.S. National Competition

1.1 Executive Director as U.S. National Administrator

The Executive Director of the International Law Students Association shall act as United States National Administrator (*hereinafter* National Administrator). (*See also* Official Rule 4.1.2.) All communications to the National Administrator shall be sent to:

All correspondence pertaining to the Competition should be clearly marked "Jessup Competition Materials". Mail addressed and marked as such shall be given immediate priority by the National Administrator, and the National Administrator shall not be responsible for delays caused by improperly addressed or labeled correspondence. *Fax communications (especially for general Competition information and Rules clarifications), is preferred when possible.*

1.2 U.S. Regional Competitions

1.2.1 Establishment of Regional Competitions

Pursuant to Official Rule 5.2, the National Administrator shall attempt to establish as many U.S. Regional Competitions as are necessary to maintain annual participation, at a level of 10-14 schools in each Region.

1.2.2 Appointment of Regional Administrators

Upon confirmation of Host School status, the National Administrator shall appoint at each Host School a Regional Administrator for purposes of administering the Regional Competition. The Regional Administrator shall be chosen according to the guidelines established by Official Rule 5.3, and shall possess all powers conferred upon Regional Administrators in the Official Rules, as well as those specifically delegated under the provisions of these Supplemental Rules.

1.2.3 Geographic Location and Regional Assignments

As Regional Host Schools are confirmed, every effort shall be made by the National Administrator to group participating schools on a geographic basis around the host locations. All participating schools must attend the U.S. Regional to which they are assigned.

1.2.4 Exceptions

Exceptions to Regional assignments will be made only in extenuating circumstances, and only at the discretion of the National Administrator. All exceptions must be confirmed in writing. Schools wishing to request exceptions must do so in writing at least twenty-eight (28) days prior to the Regional Competition date for which they are

scheduled, and/or twenty-eight (28) days prior to the date of the Regional Competition to which they wished to be moved (whichever period is shorter).

1.3 Obligation to Host; Conditional Status Preferences and Penalties

Each participating U.S. school *should* host a Regional Competition at least once during every twelve (12) years of competition participation. Each participating U.S. school *shall* host a Regional Competition once during every eighteen (18) years of competition participation. This rule is retroactive as of September, 1989. Schools which have participated twelve (12) years or more, and which fall below the required hosting rate of 5.56% (one time per eighteen (18) years of participation--*see* Supplement Appendix I) shall be placed on notice of their delinquent status at the beginning of the Competition year.

1.3.1 Conditional Status

U.S. Regional Host Schools shall not be required to take more than fourteen (14) teams per Region. If a shortage of available participation slots occurs, schools which are delinquent in the hosting rate shall be placed on *conditional status*. Those schools on conditional status shall be ranked in order of the worst to the best hosting records. If a shortage of participation slots continues through the completion of scheduling of U.S. Regional Competitions, schools on conditional status shall be removed from the Competition, with a refund of participation fees.

Schools placed on conditional status but allowed to participate shall receive the lowest priority in the geographical consideration of Regional Competition arrangement under the provisions of Supplemental Rule 1.2.3.

1.3.2 Determination of Host Rankings

Host rankings shall be determined by: 1) hosting rates, 2) the number of years of participation in the competition, and 3) the first year of Competition participation. Schools on conditional status shall be allowed to participate in the Competition only to the extent that there are spaces available. Available spaces shall be filled according to inverse ranking of hosting records; priority being given to the schools with the best hosting records.

1.3.3 Participation by Special Agreement

Schools for which there are no available participation slots may attempt to make special participation arrangements with a Regional Host school, in cooperation with the National Administrator. If the petitioning school and the Regional Host school achieve an agreeable solution allowing for participation which does not substantially affect the participation of currently scheduled teams, they shall submit confirmation of the arrangement to the National Administrator in writing no less than fourteen (14) days prior to the date of the Regional Competition. Such arrangement shall become valid upon written approval of the National Administrator.

1.3.4 Host Application Procedure

Applications to Host future Regional Competitions may be submitted, in writing, to the National Administrator at any time.

1.3.5 Waiver of Fees for Host Schools

The teams of Host Schools may participate in the Regional Competition occurring at their own school, provided that the provisions of Official Rule 6.5 are strictly enforced.

Host Schools which are willing to send their team to another U.S. Regional Competition shall have their participation fee waived.

SUPPLEMENT TO OFFICIAL RULE 3.0

Eligibility and Registration Procedures

3.1 Registration of U.S. Teams

All participating U.S. Schools (except those from Puerto Rico) shall submit an official U.S. International Registration Form with the appropriate registration fee by the date noted on the Official U.S. Competition Timetable for the current Competition year, appended to these Supplemental Rules. Registration forms postmarked/mailed after that date will not be accepted.

3.2 Withdrawal of U.S. Teams from Competition

3.2.1 General

Withdrawal from the Competition after the date noted on the Official U.S. Competition Timetable will result in forfeiture of the registration fee. There will be no exceptions.

3.2.2 Late Withdrawal and Failure to Submit Memorials

Failure on the part of a registered school to notify the National Administrator directly, in writing, by certified mail, of intended withdrawal by 31 December in any Competition year shall preclude that school from participating in the following year's Competition. Failure of a registered school to submit a memorial on the date noted on the Official U.S. Competition Timetable for submission of memorials in any year's Competition shall likewise preclude that school from participating in the following year's Competition.

3.2.3 Exceptions

Exceptions to the previous Rule regarding exclusion from the Competition will be allowed only upon a showing of extreme extenuating circumstances, at the sole discretion of the National Administrator. Appeals of the decision of the National Administrator pertaining to this rule may be made to either the next ILSA Spring Congress (April) or Fall Congress (November). The decision of the National Administrator may be reversed by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of ILSA member societies from the United States present and voting on the request.

3.3 Administration of U.S. Local Competitions

3.3.1 Right of First refusal to International Law Society

The International Law Society at each U.S. school, or its ILSA member equivalent, has the right of first refusal to field a Jessup team and to provide local administration at each participating U.S. school. If the International Law Society chooses to field a team, it may proceed with its own selection process, in accordance with the provisions of the Official Rules of the Competition.

3.3.2 Administration by Faculty Advisor

If the International Law Society chooses not to exercise its option to administer the Jessup team, the faculty advisor of the International Law Society shall have the option of establishing a special Jessup class for the purpose, where academic circumstances permit. In instances where such a class is established, the faculty advisor of other professor teaching the class shall not violate the provisions of Official Rule 3.5 regarding assistance to teams in the administration of the class.

3.3.3 Moot Court Boards and Other Situations

In the event that neither of the options in Supplemental Rules 3.3.1 or 3.3.2 is exercised, local administration may be undertaken by the participating school's Moot Court Board, or equivalent body, in cooperation with the International Law Society.

3.3.4 Necessity for Open Try-Outs

If an ILSA member International Law Society or its equivalent has not exercised its option to directly administer the local Competition, *all* members of the student body at the participating school must be given an equal opportunity to try-out for the Jessup team. Under no circumstances may Jessup participation be conditioned upon participation in any other Moot Court Program, international or domestic, or be conducted in any manner which would violate the provisions of Official Rule 3.4.

3.3.5 Grounds for Elimination

In situations in which a local team is administered under the provisions of Supplemental Rules 3.3.2 or 3.3.3, teams which are found to have received improper assistance through participation in a class designed for Jessup team selection, or which have been selected by Moot Court Boards or other bodies by procedures deemed by the National Administrator to be in violation of Official Rule 3.4 or Supplemental Rule 3.3.4, shall be eliminated from the U.S. Competition. Teams eliminated from the Competition on these grounds will not be entitled to a refund of any registration fees.

3.3.6 Remedy of Selection Process

If the team selection process which led to the elimination of a team from the Competition under the provisions of Supplemental Rule 3.3.5 can be remedied prior to the final registration deadline as noted in Supplemental Rule 3.2.1, the National Administrator may permit the selection of a new team in accordance with the provisions of the Official Rules of the Competition and the U.S. Supplemental Rules. However, the new team may not consist of any members of the previous team, may not receive advice or coaching from members of the previous team, nor may it be provided access to any of the work completed by the members of the previous team. Further violations of these Supplemental Rules regarding the team selection process shall result in the final elimination of the school from the Competition for the current Competition year, and may result in the withholding of future Competition invitations.

SUPPLEMENT TO OFFICIAL RULE 5.0

Regional Competitions

5.1 Date and Place of U.S. Oral Pleadings

All U.S. Regionals shall be held on the dates indicated on the Official U.S. Competition Timetable for the current Competition year, appended to these Supplemental U.S. Rules as Supplemental Appendix II, unless otherwise arranged by the National Administrator under the provisions of these Rules.

5.2 Conduct of U.S. Regional Competitions

U.S. Regional Competitions shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Official Rule 5.4, subject to the provisions of these Supplemental Rules.

5.3 U.S. Regional Pairings

5.3.1 Process

The National Administrator shall conduct the pairing of teams for all U.S. Regional Competitions as soon as is possible after the 31 December withdrawal deadline.. Pairing of all teams shall be by random selection, in the presence of an independent witness.

5.3.2 Notification of Regional Administrators

Regional Administrators shall be notified by telephone or fax, as well as concurrent first class mail, of the pairings for their Region as soon as is possible after pairings are complete.

5.3.3 Notification of Participating Teams

Regional Administrators shall notify *within forty-eight (48) hours of receipt of Regional pairings*, by telephone or fax, the local administrator of each team participating in the Regional Competition of the: 1) official pairings for the Regional Competition, 2) oral argument times, 3) oral argument locations, and 4) any changes in the mailing addresses or contact names of opposing teams. Regional Administrators shall not be held responsible for the failure of good faith efforts to reach the local administrator for participating schools by telephone within the time limit. *In all cases, notification of pairings, times and locations of oral arguments, and opposing team addresses shall be sent by first class mail to each participating team's local administrator within the forty-eight (48) hour period.*

5.3.4 Re-pairing upon Team Withdrawal

In the event that a team or teams within a Region withdraw after the withdrawal deadline has passed and Regional pairings are complete, the National Administrator shall immediately adapt the Regional pairings. If it is possible to adjust the pairings without conducting a new random draw, the Regional pairings shall be adjusted so as to affect the least number of teams. If it is impossible to adjust the pairings without substantially affecting the original pairings, the National Administrator shall conduct a new random draw. The provisions of Supplemental Rules 5.3.2 and 5.3.3 shall then apply upon the completion of the new pairings.

5.4 Representation in International Rounds

The National Administrator shall attempt to schedule a number of Regional Competitions equal to the number of international representatives to which the United States is entitled under the provisions of Official Rule 5.1. In such instances, the winner of each Regional Competition shall be entitled to one (1) of the allotted participation slots for the United States.

5.5 Special Invitations

Special Invitations, or “wildcard” slots, for the International Rounds of the Competition will be presented to teams which participated in the U.S. Regional Competitions **IF** there are less Regional Competitions than there are participation slots available to U.S. teams.

5.5.1 Selection of Teams Receiving Special Invitations

Special Invitations will be issued pursuant to the following procedure: all teams participating in U.S. Regional Competitions with win-loss records of 4-0 and 3-1 will be placed in the running for Special Invitations. The National Administrator, in cooperation with the Assistant Jessup Administrator, will rank the teams in order of win-loss records and raw scores, pursuant to Official Rule 10.5.1. The highest ranking teams will be sent Special Invitations until all remaining participation slots are filled.

5.5.2 Additional U.S. Regional Competitions

If it is necessary to hold more than twelve (12) U.S. Regional Competitions, the National Administrator, under the powers granted by Official Rule 12.3, shall allow the winning teams of such Competitions to advance to the International Rounds as additional U.S. Representatives.

5.5.3 Procedure for Special Invitations

The selection of teams receiving Special Invitations, if any, will not be made until the results of ALL U.S. Regional Competitions are received by the National Administrator. Teams should not call the Competition Office inquiring as to Special Invitation status unless notified prior to Regional Competitions that such positions will be available, and then not until at least forty-eight (48) hours after the completion of the last U.S. Regional Competition. Upon completion of the selection process, the National Administrator shall notify the appropriate teams at the earliest possible time by telephone, with concurrent written notification by first class mail.

SUPPLEMENT TO OFFICIAL RULE 8.0

Memorials

8.1 Paper Size

All U.S. Memorials shall be printed on standard letter size paper (8 1/2” x 11”).

8.2 Mailing of Memorials for U.S. Regional Competitions

Mailing of memorials for U.S. Regional Competitions must be done directly through a United States Post Office, **via First Class Certified or Registered mail. Private mail**

services may be used only under the provisions of Supplemental Rule 8.3.3. Teams must retain their date-stamped certified or registered mail receipts as proof of date of mailing.

8.2.1 Memorial Submission Deadline

All memorials must be submitted by the deadline noted on the Official U.S. Competition Timetable, appended to these Supplemental Rules. The submission deadline noted in the Appendix to these Supplemental Rules shall be considered the official submission deadline for purposes of Official Rules 8.5 and 8.8.

8.2.2 Submission Requirements

Each participating U.S. team shall fulfill the following mailing requirements:

- (A) TWENTY (20) copies of their APPLICANT memorial and TWENTY (20) copies of their RESPONDENT memorial shall be mailed to the REGIONAL ADMINISTRATOR.
- (B) ONE (1) copy of the APPROPRIATE memorial shall be mailed to EACH OPPOSING TEAM which will be faced in the REGIONAL COMPETITION.
- (C) ONE (1) copy of their APPLICANT memorial and ONE (1) copy of their RESPONDENT memorial shall be mailed to the NATIONAL ADMINISTRATOR.

Teams are advised to complete and mail their memorials as soon as possible after receiving their regional pairings. Mailing deadlines will be strictly enforced.

8.3 Mailing Procedure

8.3.1 U.S. Mail as Primary Mailing Selection

The U. S. Postal Service shall be the preferred provider of mailing services for Competition purposes.

8.3.2 U.S. Mail Procedures

Either postage stamps or metered stamps may be used for postage.

8.3.2.1 Postage Stamps or Private Metered Stamps

If postage stamps or private meter stamps are used, an OFFICIAL U.S. POSTAL SERVICE HAND DATE STAMP must appear on the package. In such cases, the OFFICIAL USPS HAND DATE STAMP shall be considered, for purposes of determining the date of mailing, the official date-stamp.

Postage stamps or private meter stamps without the additional OFFICIAL USPS HAND-DATE STAMP will be penalized pursuant to Supplemental Rule 11.4.

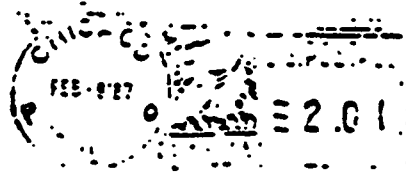
8.3.2.2 Official U.S.P.S. Meter Stamps

OFFICIAL USPS METER STAMPS issued at the time of mailing are considered OFFICIAL USPS HAND DATE STAMPS and therefore do not require the additional Hand Date Stamp. *In these cases, the date appearing on the OFFICIAL USPS METER*

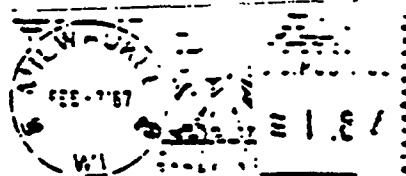
STAMP shall be considered, for purposes of determining the date of mailing, the official date stamp.

Examples of the two existing versions of the OFFICIAL USPS METER STAMPS, as recognized by the National Administrator, appear below:

It is the responsibility of each U.S. team to ensure and verify that their package is properly dated and stamped.

8.3.2.3 Computer Meter Stamps

The U.S. Postal Service is currently adopting a computerized metering process. Computer meter stamps issued by the U.S. Postal Service will be recognized for Competition purposes **IF** the date is clearly printed on the stamp. Meter stamps involving bar-code readings only must have an accompanying Hand-Date Stamp. If it is not possible to receive a Hand-Date Stamp on any piece of mail which does not contain a clearly noted U.S.P.S. dated postmark, teams should fulfill mailing requirements through private services as provided by Supplemental Rule 8.3.3.

8.3.3 Federal Express

The National Administrator recognizes the fact that certain U.S. Postal Offices maintain irregular hours, and that Hand-Date Stamp requirements will not always be fulfilled by every Postal Office. Therefore, teams may elect to send their memorials via Federal Express. However, Federal Express is the **ONLY** private mail courier recognized for Competition Mailing purposes. Teams which utilize Federal Express must note the contents of the package as "Jessup Competition Memorials" on the shipping invoice.

8.3.3.1 Tracking Label as Official Date Stamp

For purposes of memorial mailings via Federal Express, the Official Federal Express Tracking Label affixed to the package upon receipt by the Federal Express Courier shall be used for purposes of determining Competition mailing dates. If the date on the Official Tracking Label differs from the date on the Package Invoice, the Tracking Label shall supersede the date on the Invoice. It is the responsibility of the team using Federal Express to verify that packages will be picked-up and dated in accordance with Competition timetables.

8.3.3.2 Consistency in Mailing

Teams which elect to send memorials via Federal Express must fulfill ALL Regional Competition mailing requirements outlined in Supplemental Rule 8.2.2 via Federal Express. Teams may not send only a portion of their memorials via Federal Express, unless remedying a "wrong memorial mailing" under the provisions of Supplemental Rule 11.3.2. Teams which violate the provisions of this Supplemental Rule will be subject to a five (5) point late-mailing penalty regardless of whether the memorials were mailed on time.

8.3.3.3 Pre-Notification of Teams and Regional Administrator

Teams utilizing Federal Express for Competition mailing purposes shall notify by telephone or facsimile (FAX) all opposing team contacts, as well as the Regional Administrator, of their intent to do so. It shall be determined from each team contact and the Regional Administrator the method of Federal Express delivery they prefer. If a team contact or the Regional Administrator requires a signature upon delivery, packages must be sent with a signature requirement. If team contacts or the Regional Administrator approve a delivery without signature, this option may then be used.

In the case of Federal Express deliveries which do not require a receipt signature that are lost or misplaced prior to being delivered to the team contact, the date of the original Federal Express mailing shall be used for purposes of determining Competition mailing dates. Teams may request that Federal Express deliveries requiring a signature be made to a law school secretary or faculty advisor who maintains regular office hours. In the event that a team contact misses a delivery requiring a signature, it is the responsibility of the team contact to acquire the package from the nearest Federal Express Office, or to schedule re-delivery of the package.

8.3.3.4 Federal Express Verification

Teams utilizing the Federal Express mailing option shall keep copies of all Shipping Invoices as proof of mailing.

8.3.3.5 Failure to Pick-up Mailing

Teams desiring to use the Federal Express mailing option are encouraged to deliver packages in person to the nearest Federal Express Office, or to personally deliver the packages to a Federal Express Courier. The failure on the part of Federal Express to pick-up a package on the appropriate date will not provide an excuse for late mailing under the provisions of the Competition Rules. Similarly, packages left at a Federal Express drop-site will be considered mailed on the date they are picked-up by a Federal Express Courier. Teams which do not properly deliver or label any package will be penalized for any mailing delays which occur. It is the responsibility of participating teams to ensure memorials are properly transferred to the control of the Federal Express Offices.

8.4 Verification of Mailing Dates

8.4.1 U.S. Postal Services Mailings

Any complaints concerning late mailings can be irrefutably rebutted by producing the appropriate certified or registered mail receipt with a recognized OFFICIAL USPS HAND DATE STAMP showing the official mailing date of the package. A reproduction of a meter stamp alone will not suffice, unless the team has failed to send memorials via

certified or registered mail (in which case the appropriate penalties will be assessed). The following is an example of such a certified mail receipt:

8.4.2 Federal Express

Any complaints concerning late mailings via Federal Express can be irrefutably rebutted by producing the appropriate Shipping Invoice, with the contents of the package clearly marked as "Jessup Competition Memorials". For purposes of verification, the Regional or National Administrator shall contact the nearest Federal Express Offices. The date noted in the Federal Express Package Tracking System as the Shipping Date of the package containing the tracking number recorded on the invoice shall be considered the official mailing date.

8.5 Notification of Receipt of Memorials

Teams that desire notification of receipt of their memorials by any party may, in addition, send memorials via U.S. Postal Service "Return Receipt Requested." For purposes of Federal Express mailings, a delivery requiring a receipt signature shall serve the same purpose.

8.6 Mailings to Regional Administrator

The teams of U.S. Regional Host schools **must** mail their memorials to the Regional Administrator in the same manner as all other teams in the Regional Competition, pursuant to these Supplemental Rules.

8.7 Labeling of Packages

All mailing packages must be clearly marked "Jessup Competition Materials" and show the name of the school on the outside of the package.

SUPPLEMENT TO OFFICIAL RULE 9.0

Oral Pleadings

9.1 Procedure

Oral pleadings in U.S. regional Competitions shall be conducted in accordance with the provisions of Official Rule 9.0.

9.2 Delegation of Power to U.S. Regional Administrators

The National Administrator hereby delegates to U.S. Regional Administrators the powers otherwise given to the National Administrator in Official Rule 9.0, including the power to conduct *ex parte* proceedings under the provisions of Official Rule 9.8.

SUPPLEMENT TO OFFICIAL RULE 10.0

Scoring and Reporting of Results

10.1 Scoring of U.S. Regional Competitions

U.S. Regional Competitions shall be scored in accordance with the provisions of Official Rule 10.0.

10.2 Notification of Scores to Teams Participating in Regional Competitions

Within fourteen (14) days of the completion of a U.S. Regional Competition, the Regional Administrator shall submit to each of the teams participating in the Regional Competition copies of their: 1) official Jessup Team Scoresheets; 2) their oral pleading Judge's individual scoresheets, with Judge's comments (if any); 3) their team memorial Judge's individual scoresheets, with Judge's comments (if any); 4) the official rankings for the Regional Competition; and 5) the full results of the Best Memorial and Best Oralist competitions for the Regional Competition.

10.3 Notification of Results to Jessup Office

Within forty-eight (48) hours of the completion of a Regional Competition, the Regional Administrator shall transmit, by telephone or facsimile (FAX), to the National Administrator: 1) the names and team numbers of the Regional Champion and Regional Runner-Up; 2) the overall rankings for the Regional Competition, including the win-loss records, raw points, and all judge's points for all teams which participated; and 3) Best Oralist and Best Memorial competition results. At the same time results are sent to each school participating in the Regional Competition under the provisions of the Supplemental Rule 10.2 above, a full copy of the Regional schedules and results, including all team scoresheets and individual judging ballots, shall be mailed to the National Administrator at the Jessup Office. Copies of team registration forms (with team member's names clearly written) and the names and contact addresses for each judge which participated in the Regional Competition must be included in this mailing. The Regional Administrator shall retain copies of all Regional Competition records for six (6) months following the completion of the Regional Competition.

10.4 Failure to Notify National Administrator of Regional Competition Results

Upon the failure of a Regional Administrator to fulfill the requirements of Supplemental Rule 10.3 within the applicable deadlines, the National Administrator shall notify the

Regional Administrator of such failure. The Regional Administrator shall then have seven (7) days from the date of notification to remedy the situation. Failure to comply may result in the National Administrator denying the Regional Host appropriate credit for fulfillment of Regional Hosting obligations outlined in the Supplemental Rule 1.3. Appeals of the decision of the National Administrator pertaining to this rule may be made to either the next ILSA Spring Congress (April) or Fall Congress (November). The decision of the National Administrator may be reversed by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of ILSA member societies from the U.S. present and voting on the request.

SUPPLEMENT TO OFFICIAL RULE 11.0

Penalties

11.1 Procedure - General

All U.S. Regional Competition penalty point procedures shall follow the same format as the procedures outlined in the Official Rules, with the following additions:

11.2 Filing of Memorial Mailing Complaints

All complaints regarding mailing of Competition memorials by opposing teams must be addressed to the REGIONAL ADMINISTRATOR, with copies being sent to the NATIONAL ADMINISTRATOR and the TEAM ACCUSED of the alleged violation.

11.2.1 Complaints Regarding Memorials - General

11.2.1.1 Late Mailing Complaints

Reports by participants regarding memorial violations are *limited to*:

- (a) infractions regarding tardiness in mailing;
- (b) failure to send memorials via required mailing procedures; and
- (c) submission of wrong memorials to an opposing team.

Violations regarding memorial form, as per Official Rule 8.0 and its U.S. Supplemental Rule, shall be ascertained and assessed by the Regional Administrator, in consultation with the National Administrator if necessary.

11.2.1.2 Citations and Footnote Format

Violations regarding citation and footnote format (not including penalties for spacing provisions), as per Official Rule 8.2.8, are to be ascertained and assessed *by memorial judges only*. Neither of these two violations may be assessed as the result of a participant's complaint.

11.2.1.3 Procedure

Complaints pertaining to mailing of memorials must be postmarked within fourteen (14) days after the date noted on the Official U.S. Timetable for the mailing of the memorials, with copies sent to the REGIONAL ADMINISTRATOR, the NATIONAL ADMINISTRATOR and the TEAM IN ALLEGED VIOLATION as per the requirements of Supplemental Rule 11.1. If memorials are received too late to mail the complaints

before the deadline required by this Supplemental Rule, complaints may be registered by telephone or facsimile (FAX) to the Regional Administrator, the National Administrator, and the accused team, and the written complaint must be immediately sent to the National Administrator. Written copies of the complaint should, in these instances, be hand delivered to the Regional Administrator prior to the first Round of the Regional Competition.

11.2.2 Types and Assessment of Memorial Complaints

There are two types of memorial penalties which apply to the U.S. Regional Competitions: SPECIFIC and GENERIC.

11.2.2.1 Specific Penalties

SPECIFIC PENALTIES are penalties assessed against one allegedly violating team in accordance with confirmed complaints regarding failure to meet mailing deadlines brought against that team by another participating team. SPECIFIC penalties will be assessed against the violating team's offending memorial (either Applicant or Respondent) *only* in the round in which the complaining team and the violating team are paired.

Example

A 5-point late mailing penalty is assessed against the violating team's Applicant memorial in Round 1 of the Regional Competition, as a result of a confirmed complaint by the team against which the violating team is paired (Respondent) in that Round (i.e., they did not submit the proper memorial to their opposing team in time). This 5-point penalty will then result in a 15-point total deduction — 5-points on each of three memorial judge's scores, for that Round only.

Specific Penalties shall not be considered in the calculations for Best Memorial Awards in the Regional Competition.

11.2.2.2 Generic Penalties

GENERIC PENALTIES are penalties assessed by the National Administrator, or the Regional Administrator where applicable, on a generic, or "across the board", basis. GENERIC Penalties are assessed in *all* of the Regional Competition Rounds in which the team competes. GENERIC Penalties may partially or totally cancel out any SPECIFIC penalties. In an effort to clarify the application of this rule, examples of such instances follow:

Example 1

Team A is assessed a 2-point GENERIC Penalty by the National Administrator for failure to have an OFFICIAL USPS HAND DATE STAMP affixed to their private meter stamped memorial mailings. Team A will be assessed a 2-point penalty on each of the three memorial judge's scores in each Round of the Regional Competition (six (6) points per round total) in which they argue.

Example 2

Same situation as Example 1, except the GENERIC Penalty is assessed only against the mailing of the Respondent memorial (i.e., the Applicant and

Respondent memorials were, for some reason, mailed separately). Team A will be penalized only in the Regional Competition Rounds in which they argue as the Respondent.

Example 3

Team A is the subject of a confirmed complaint by Team B, who they face in a Regional Competition Round, regarding the failure to affix an OFFICIAL USPS HAND DATE STAMP to their private meter stamped memorial mailing, and a 2-point SPECIFIC penalty is assessed by the Regional Administrator. No GENERIC penalty was assessed by the National Administrator for the violation (*i.e.*, it wasn't noticed by or brought to the attention of the National Administrator). The 2-point SPECIFIC Penalty shall be assessed against Team A on each of the three individual memorial judge's scoresheets for the offending memorial in that Round of the Regional Competition only. (Had more than one opposing team properly noted the mistake, the SPECIFIC Penalty would apply in each Round in which such a team was faced.)

Example 4

Same situation as Example 3, except the violation was also the source of a GENERIC Penalty assessed by the National Administrator. As both Penalties were the result of the same infraction, the GENERIC Penalty will cancel the SPECIFIC Penalty. Thus, Team A would be subject to a 2-point deduction on each individual judge's memorial scoresheet in each Round of the Regional Competition. (Same result as Example 1.) If the GENERIC Penalty is assessed only against one set of memorials (either Team A's Applicant or Respondent memorial only), and the SPECIFIC Penalty applies to the memorial which was not subject to the GENERIC Penalty, the SPECIFIC Penalty shall apply as in Example 3. (Thus, if Team A's Applicant memorial is the subject of a 2-point GENERIC penalty, while for some reason the Respondent memorial is not, yet the Respondent memorial is itself subject to a 2-point SPECIFIC penalty, Team A would be penalized for the GENERIC Penalty in both Regional Competition Rounds in which they argued as the Applicant, as well as the SPECIFIC Penalty with regard to the Respondent memorial in the Round in which they argued as Respondent against the team complaining of the violation.)

Example 5

Team A is assessed a 2-point GENERIC Penalty by the National Administrator for failure to have an OFFICIAL USPS HAND DATE STAMP affixed to their private meter stamped memorial mailings. Team A is also assessed a 1-point GENERIC Penalty by the Regional Administrator for failure to send memorials via certified or registered mail. Team A will be assessed a 3-point GENERIC penalty on each of the three memorial judge's individual scoresheets in each Round of the Regional Competition in which they argue. If Team A is the subject of a SPECIFIC Penalty for either of the two violations for which a GENERIC Penalty was assessed, the GENERIC Penalty will cancel the SPECIFIC Penalty.

Example 6

Same situation as Example 5, except Team A fails to secure the HAND DATE STAMP for only one opposing team mailing. The SPECIFIC Penalty for that offense would apply in the Round in which Team A argued against the

complaining team, in addition to the GENERIC Penalties, while in all other Rounds only the GENERIC penalty will apply.

Generic mailing penalties shall be considered in the calculations for Best Memorial Award.

11.2.3 Clarifications Regarding Memorial Penalty Rules

All questions regarding the interpretation of memorial penalties *generally*, lodged *prior* to the date of mailing of memorials, should be set forth clearly in writing and sent via first class mail or facsimile (FAX) to the National Administrator, with a copy sent to the Regional Administrator. All questions regarding the interpretation or application of memorial penalties in the U.S. Regional Competitions by participants *after* the date of mailing of memorials shall be directed to the Administrator, Regional or National, which imposed the penalty in question, with a copy sent to the other. *All questions from Regional Administrators regarding the interpretation or application of memorial penalties in the U.S. Regional Competitions shall be directed to the National Administrator in writing.* Decisions of the Regional Administrator regarding the assessment of memorial penalties which are related to interpretations of the Competition Rules at the Regional level and which are made within the scope of the delegated powers shall be considered final, unless it can be shown that the interpretation of the rule itself by the Regional Administrator was erroneous. In such instances, decisions of the Regional Administrator may be appealed to the National Administrator. Decisions of the National Administrator regarding memorial penalties are final and binding.

11.3 Filing of Complaints Concerning Oral Pleadings

Complaints pertaining specifically to oral pleadings in the U.S. Regional Competitions shall be governed by the provisions of the Official Rules.

11.4 Non-Discretionary Memorial Penalties

11.4.1 Penalties for Violations of Primary Mailing Requirements

Official Rules 11.3.1.1.1 through 11.3.1.1.3 shall apply in the U.S. Regional Competitions, in addition to the following memorial mailing penalty provisions.

11.4.1.1 Use of postage stamps or private metered stamps without OFFICIAL USPS HAND DATE STAMP

Teams which use postage stamps or private metered stamps for memorial mailings without an OFFICIAL USPS HAND DATE STAMP will be subject to a two (2) point penalty on the offending memorial.

11.4.1.2 Failure to send memorials via certified or registered mail

Teams which fail to send memorials via certified or registered mail will be subject to a one (1) point penalty on the offending memorial.

11.4.1.3 Combination Violation

Teams which use postage stamps or private metered stamps without an OFFICIAL USPS HAND DATE STAMP *and* fail to send memorials via certified or registered mail will be subject to a six (6) point penalty on the offending memorial.

11.4.1.4 Submission of Wrong Memorial to Opposing Team

Teams which submit the wrong memorial to opposing team (including instances where twenty (20) copies of team memorials are mailed to the National Administrator and one (1) to the Regional Administrator) will be subject to a two (2) point SPECIFIC penalty, in addition to an late mailing penalties which may be imposed.

11.4.1.5 Additional Penalties

In addition to the penalties outlined herein, the provisions of Official Rule 11.3.1 shall also apply to U.S. Regional Competitions.

11.4.2 Additional Penalties for Failure to Correct Mailing of Improper Memorial

In the event that the wrong memorial is mailed to an opposing team under the requirements of Supplemental Rule 8.2.2, the correct memorial must be sent immediately upon notice of the error (including instances where twenty (20) memorials were sent to the National Administrator and one (1) was sent to the Regional Administrator). Failure to do so may result in the assessment of additional discretionary penalties by the Regional Administrator. Discretionary penalties imposed under this rule will be considered SPECIFIC Penalties and shall be assessed at the rate of two (2) points for the first day of delay, and one (1) additional point for each successive day of delay. Private express mail services may be used for purposes of second mailings. Incorrect memorials which are postmarked in a proper and timely fashion shall be subject only to the 2-point "wrong memorial" penalty, unless the time taken to correct the problem extends past the memorial mailing deadline noted in the U.S. Supplemental Timetable. Incorrect memorials which do not satisfy the requirements of the primary postmark methods or deadline shall also be subject to any additional penalties as required by these Supplemental Rules. The following examples are intended to clarify the application of this rule:

Example 1

Team A's memorials are properly postmarked and mailed, and arrive before the Competition mailing deadline. However, it is discovered that the improper memorial was sent to an opposing team. The proper memorials do not arrive until the third day after notification of the error, but still prior to the Competition mailing deadline. The 2-point wrong memorial penalty would be assessed, but no penalties for delay would be incurred. If the proper memorials did not arrive prior to the Competition mailing deadline, a 2-point discretionary penalty would be assessed for the first day after the deadline had passed, and additional 1-point discretionary penalties may be assessed for each additional day of delay. Note that such penalties are incurred only for days of delay *after* the mailing deadline had passed. No penalty would be assessed for the day the memorials arrived.

Example 2

Team A's memorials are properly marked, but are mailed one day late and subject to a GENERIC 5-point penalty for tardiness. It is then discovered that wrong memorial was mailed to an opposing team, resulting in a SPECIFIC Penalty of 2-points. The situation takes three days to correct (i.e., the new memorial is not postmarked for 3 days), resulting in further 2-point and 1-point discretionary penalties for delay. Team A's memorials would thus be assessed a 5-point GENERIC deduction for each round of the Regional Competition, and an additional 5-point SPECIFIC deduction in the Round involving the team which received the incorrect memorial.

A team receiving the wrong memorial from an opposing team shall immediately return it to the opposing team, without viewing the contents, pursuant to Official Rule 8.9. This may be accomplished by regular first class mail.

11.5 Non-Discretionary Oral Pleadings Penalties

Official Rules 11.3.2 and 11.3.3 shall apply in all U.S. Regional Competitions.

11.6 Discretionary Penalties

Official Rule 11.4 shall apply in all U.S. Regional Competitions.

11.7 DE MINIMUS Rule

Official Rule 11.6 shall apply in all U.S. Regional Competitions.

11.8 Appeals and Consultation

In general, Official Rules 11.5 and 11.9 shall govern the appeals process in U.S. Regional Competitions. All penalties assessed by the Regional Administrator, and not involving the consultation of the National Administrator, may be appealed to the National Administrator, whose decision is final. Complaints regarding violations involving SPECIFIC penalties or infractions in the U.S. Regional Competitions shall first be filed with the Regional Administrator. The Regional Administrator may consult directly with the National Administrator prior to the imposition of any penalty. Regional Administrators *shall* consult with the National Administrator regarding any complaints which involve the imposition of GENERIC Penalties.

With regard to non-discretionary penalty assessments, a strong presumption of correctness as to the finding of fact shall lie with the decision of the Regional Administrator. Clear and convincing evidence of improper conduct or misapplication of a Rule must be presented in order to rebut such presumptions on appeal.

SUPPLEMENT TO OFFICIAL RULE 12.0

Interpretation of Rules

12.1 Delegation of Authority to Regional Administrators

The National Administrator hereby delegates to U.S. Regional Administrators the powers otherwise given to the National Administrator in Official Rule 12.0 for purposes of U.S. Regional Competitions, except with regard to appeals from penalty assessments. (*See Supplemental to Official Rule 11.8.*)

SUPPLEMENTAL RULE 13.0

U.S. Regional Competition Awards

13.1 U.S. Regional Competition Awards

The U.S. Regional Administrators shall each present eight (8) primary Awards and four (4) Honorable Mention Awards based upon individual and team performance in the U.S. Regional Competitions.

13.1.1 Primary Awards

The primary Awards to be presented are as follows:

- (a) REGIONAL CHAMPION (who shall proceed to the International Semifinals)
- (b) REGIONAL RUNNER-UP (who will replace the Regional Champion in the event that team is unable to be present at the International Semifinals)
- (c) FIRST PLACE - ORALIST
- (d) SECOND PLACE - ORALIST
- (e) THIRD PLACE - ORALIST
- (f) FIRST PLACE - MEMORIAL (this team will submit its memorials for the U.S. Rutgers Award and the Hardy C. Dillard Award Competitions--see Official Rules for further details)
- (g) SECOND PLACE - MEMORIAL
- (h) THIRD PLACE - MEMORIAL

Participants shall be provided "physical awards", in the form of plaques or certificates, for accomplishment meriting a primary award, and shall have such accomplishment noted in the summary of Regional results.

13.1.2 Honorable Mention Awards

Honorable Mention Awards shall be presented as follows:

- (a) FOURTH PLACE - ORALIST
- (b) FIFTH PLACE - ORALIST
- (c) FOURTH PLACE - MEMORIAL
- (d) FIFTH PLACE - MEMORIAL

Participants meriting an honorable mention award, shall be provided "physical awards", in the form of plaques or certificates at the discretion of the Regional Administrator. Participants meriting honorable mention shall have such accomplishment noted in the summary of Regional results.
